History Teaching in and beyond the formal curriculum

The organizing committee of the 36th South African Society for History Teaching (SASHT) conference invites oral/paper and poster presentations from delegates across the history education sector. This year's conference will be hosted at the historic Genadendal Museum from 29 to 30 September 2022 with the theme **History Teaching in and Beyond the Formal Curriculum**.

Scholars (academics, teachers, students) are invited to submit individual abstracts or posters focused upon one of the following **sub-themes**

- History teaching in the formal school curriculum
- History teaching in the informal school curriculum
- Unofficial history teaching
- History teaching for a decolonizing school curriculum
- History teaching in private and state museums
- History teaching pedagogies in the disciplines
(Eg. environmental studies, fine and performing arts, heritage, medicine, sport studies, war, religion, nutrition, etc.)
- Open papers on history education themes not covered by the above

This conference is in response to a changing 21st century experiencing environmental threats, pandemics, and increasing wars. These are topics not usually covered in mainstream formal school history curricula.

An individual submission consists of a 20-minutes oral presentation, followed by a discussion. The official language of the congress is English. A person can only present one paper as the first author. Presenters should be registered for the Conference (please see attached banking details)

Abstracts should include:

- Name of the author(s), your institutional affiliation and position, your office and mobile phone numbers, and email addresses.
- The paper's title is followed by a 350 words (maximum) abstract of the proposed paper.
- The abstract should include the question(s) addressed in the paper, the evidence to be used, a precise statement of the argument and conclusions, and what significance the paper has to our understanding of history teaching. You do **not** need any keywords or a reference list.
- Please also specify to what sub-theme your abstract is related. This will help in to add it to a session with similar papers.

Deadline for abstract submission -26 August 2022

Acceptance of abstract - 30 August 2022
